

JEWISH STUDIES CUGS/CONCENTRATION PROGRAM GUIDE

The Concentration in Jewish Studies and the CUGS in Jewish Studies are multi-departmental programs designed to complement and enhance a student's major program, as well as to prepare students for graduate studies and professional careers. The programs are open to all Rowan undergraduate and graduate students. The purpose of the Jewish studies concentration/CUGS are to allow students to study in greater depth the historical, sociological and religious context of contemporary Jews and Jewish life. The concentration provides an interdisciplinary survey of issues related to contemporary Jews and a comparison to other ethnic and cultural groups in the United States and abroad.

To register for the Concentration or CUGS, fill out an ADD/CHANGE MAJOR form at the Registrar's Office. There is a place to ADD Concentration toward the bottom of the form, where you'll fill in "Jewish Studies." The Concentration's code is C513; the CUGS's code is M513.

A total of 18 credits are required to complete the Concentration: 9 credits are to be chosen from the Jewish focus course bank; 9 credits are to be chosen from the Contextual Core bank.

A total of 12 credits are required to complete the CUGS: 6-12 credits from the Jewish Focus courses, and/or up to 6 credits from the Contextual Core courses.
