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Our Guest Speaker

Valerie Buickerood has been a nonprofit professional since 2007. Prior to entering the nonprofit field, she spent more than a decade in the corporate sector in sales and service. After graduating from Rowan University with a BA in History, she pursued a graduate degree in U.S. History at Temple University before deciding on a career in nonprofit. Joining the development team at the Alice Paul Institute in 2007, Ms. Buickerood spent a total of 5 years at the women's history and girls leadership organization, with her last 2



years as executive director. She joined the development team at Isles, Inc. in 2012 in Trenton, NJ and Hopeworks 'N Camden in 2015 as the director of engagement and communications.

At Hopeworks, a youth development and workforce development nonprofit, Ms. Buickerood is responsible for managing all fundraising activities as well as communications. She is a long time member of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, a current member of the Committed to Camden Committee and was recently named co-chair of the Nonprofit Committee at Chamber of Commerce of Southern NJ (CCSNJ). Ms. Buickerood is a 2018 Lead NJ fellow. She has been an active volunteer as a youth mentor with several organizations and recently became a member of Better Angels, a national organization that unites red and blue Americans in a working alliance to depolarize America.

Ms. Buickerood is dedicated to helping organizations raise resources to achieve their missions and create positive social change.

She will receive a dual BA degree in Africana Studies and International Studies, with a minor in Spanish. She was awarded the university scholar status for multiple semesters at Rowan and inducted into the Chi Alpha Epsilon Academic Honor Society. She has become an unofficial Ambassador of the AS program as president of the Student Organization of African Studies, and she represented Rowan University as part of the Eritrean delegation at the 16th Annual International Model African Union Conference in Washington, D.C. Nydreama's independent internship in La Entrada, Honduras (summer 2018) exemplifies her commitment to bridging the gap between academic research and the real world. This experience greatly encouraged her to become a leader within an international environment. She has also remained connected to local groups such as Youth Action Team at the University of Pennsylvania and Youth Empowerment Program, which supports those who have been impacted by parental incarceration. After graduation, Nydreama plans to attend law school and start her own non-profit that will focus on uplifting communities for systematic improvement.

She will be an elementary school teacher next year, but will immediately begin to study to get an MA in Special Education. Her contributions to her classes suggest that she is much more. 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Joseph Foti Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management

oseph Foti will receive a BA in DPEM, a minor in Political Science and a Certificate of Undergraduate Studies in Counterterrorism Response Operations. He is also on the Dean's List. He represents the highest level dedication to the service of others through helping his community. Joseph is the founder and president of the Rowan Student Chapter of International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM). He forged a partnership with the NJ Dept of Human Services, Rowan EMS, Rowan, Dept of Public Safety/ Office of Emergency Management and the Boro of Glassboro to implement a joint training exercise in Shelter Training at Rowan for students, faculty, Glassboro residents. Glassboro Officials, and Gloucester County personnel. Joseph worked as a Research Assistant for Community Planning Project and the NJ Dept of Community Affairs analyzing NJ flood documentation. Joseph interned with the Passaic County Office of Emergency Management where he designed exercises for emergency drills, attended meetings with local and state representatives, utility and care facilities and assisted teaching a hands only CPR course for senior services personnel. Joseph, as a NJ certified EMT, has been a member of Rowan EMS and is working on his recertification as an EMT-B.



oseph is a double major in Political Science and Economics. Only five years ago, he moved from Italy to the US with no knowledge of the English language. While challenging, Joseph credits his transition for his motivation to succeed. Joseph's ambition has garnered him a number of opportunities within and outside of his department. Joseph served as a research assistant with Dr. Stuti Jha in the Economics department. His work with Dr. Jha has since inspired his personal research project through which he is exploring the correlation between community health and cancer diagnoses. Joseph also served as VP of the Rowan Students Investment Club during his sophomore year. Beyond Rowan, Joseph maintains a multi-year internship with the NJ Superior Courts in which he currently interns for the Superior Court Judge with responsibilities similar to a law clerk. Joseph has managed to excel in curricular and extracurricular activities while also working nearly full time. Joseph earned Dean's List during every semester that he was enrolled, and President's List during two of those semesters. He was one of two recipients of the 2018 Dr. Bela Mukhoti Scholarship in Economics.

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
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
