



ALYSSA LOMBARDI
American Studies

Alyssa Lombardi exemplifies the best talents of an American Studies major. She performed thorough and engaging work in Dr. Plourde's senior seminar, which explored aspects of Philadelphia. In her presentation on the First Bank of the United States, she discussed its significance in the development of the American financial system and shared photos of her friend's wedding in the building. She provided a historical overview of Palladian architecture, including its origins and theory. In her research, she includes personal photos of Palladian buildings in Italy and of the Philadelphia Art Museum. She intentionally researched the Italian Market due to her family's business ownership experiences there. The seminar allowed Alyssa to share her life experiences. In her final paper, she used her research on art, history, and politics to argue that the Philadelphia Museum of Art is outstanding in promoting artistic and social inclusion, presenting a thorough and engaging narrative.

Alondra Ramos-Serrano is receiving the 2023 Senior of Distinction in Anthropology because she is eager to apply her knowledge to existing severe problems in the real world. As a research intern for the Museum of Anthropology at Rowan University (MARU), she successfully created a professional database for the Steinhart Collection of Native American artifacts on permanent loan to the museum. She continued to foster communication with Lenni-Lenape community leaders to create culturally sensitive interpretations of Steinhart's archaeological material for public display, both in the museum and online. She plans to pursue graduate studies to acquire skills in preserving archaeological materials in her home commonwealth of Puerto Rico, where limited resources and the effects of climate change are endangering its rich heritage. Her extracurricular work in Flow Forward on Rowan campus seeks recognition and redress for a real economic hardship facing female students that impede their access to education.
