Matching students with internship opportunities

The CHSS Match Program screens and prepares students for internship opportunities. While we accept Rowan students from all majors, we primarily assist students enrolled in the following majors within the College of Humanities and Social Sciences:

Students who are successful in these majors possess skills in critical thinking, written and oral communication, creative problem-solving, research and analysis, and interpersonal understanding. Studies show that these are the skills employers value—and that workers with these skills can advance quickly if given an initial opportunity. The CHSS Match Internship Program is designed to benefit both students and employers. Students must be in Good Academic Standing to be placed in an internship. The University defines “Good Academic Standing” as possessing a GPA at or above a 2.0.

Frequently asked Questions?

Q. How do I get started?

A. All of our internship opportunities can be found at go.rowan.edu/chssintern. To apply, you will need to create an account with ProfsJobs, the university job and internship database. You will be required to submit a resume, which must be approved by the Office of Career Advancement. Once approved, your resume will be forwarded to our office and one of our trained student staff members will schedule an appointment with you. During that appointment, we will review your resume, conduct a mock interview, and provide advice on appropriate attire and workplace etiquette. At the end of the meeting, you will leave with the contact information for an internship, and the confidence to succeed in it!

Q. Can I earn credit for my internship?

A. The College of Humanities & Social Sciences has created a course entitled Internship in the Applied Liberal Arts (INTR20.399). By completing the requirements of the email-based course, you will earn between 2-6 credits per semester. Earning additional credits, of course, will require more internship hours and possibly additional academic assignments.

Q. Why should I take the internship for credit?

A. Taking the internship for credit encourages valuable reflection on your internship experience and allows you to earn credits toward your degree.

Q. Will I have a paid internship?

A. The majority of our internships are unpaid. The opportunity to earn academic credit and to gain valuable workplace experience, though, could offset the lack of monetary compensation.

Q. What if I have already located an internship?

A. This is the perfect situation—you’ve already made the right match for yourself. We can still assist you, though, if you complete our application for credit and send us your internship responsibilities, once approved, you will be sent information on registering for the *Internship in Applied Liberal Arts* class.

Q. How do I know what I am qualified to do?

A. The CHSS Match Program will help you identify the skills you can bring to the workplace. Many students who major in programs in the College of Humanities & Social Sciences are not sure about their career direction, but don’t sell yourself short: Your skills in written and oral communication, research and analysis of information, and interpersonal understanding make you a valuable employee.
