Africana Studies Major: Program Guide

(Effective Fall 2021)

For Transfers and students who enrolled at Rowan prior to Fall 2018

Each student enrolled in the Africana Studies major is required to complete a minimum of 52 credit hours of general education courses, 30 credit hours of major course requirements, and 38 credit hours of free electives. Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the major, and the lowest acceptable grade for a course in the major is a "C-". The major is structured as follows:

- 1. General Education/Rowan Experience requirements: 52 credits
- 2. Major Requirements: 30 credits
 - a. Four Africana Studies core courses: 12 credits
 - b. **Minimum** of six major electives: 18 credits
 - i. Four courses (12 credits) from the list of "Africana Electives"
 - ii. Two courses (6 credits) from the list of "Comparative/World Electives"
- 3. Free Electives: 38 credits
