

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES MINOR

Coordinator of International Studies:
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The International Studies minor is an interdisciplinary program that helps to prepare students for careers in an increasingly interdependent world. Students are introduced to a wide range of economic, political and environmental issues, and they develop expertise in the culture, history and languages of other parts of the world. International Studies may be pursued in conjunction with major and minor programs.

International Studies Minor Requirements:

Six courses (18 credits) as listed below. Two of the Area Studies/Core Courses must be at the 300 level or higher.

- **TWO** Core Courses from the core bank below.
- **THREE** Area Studies AND/OR Core Courses:
 - Courses taken to fulfill the Area Studies/Core requirements **must come from at least two departments.**
- **SECOND** Semester Foreign Language (or CLEP equivalent), e.g. Spanish II.
 - The first semester of the language does NOT count towards the Area Studies/Core course requirements. Any additional foreign language courses in this language (at a higher level) or another language (at any level) may fill Area Studies requirements.

Note re Study Abroad: Students who complete an approved Study Abroad program will have their 300/400 level Area Studies requirement reduced by one course, i.e. studying abroad counts as one of the upper level courses required for the minor. Students may also count any specific courses related to international studies taken abroad towards the minor. As long as the Study Abroad semesters are approved by the home department and the university, there is no upper limit on the number of Study Abroad credits a student may apply to International Studies.

Students wishing to obtain credit for courses not listed in the banks may submit course syllabi to the program coordinator. In general, any course that deals exclusively with global issues and/or the language, culture, or history of any of the listed geographic regions will count, but such decisions are at the discretion of the International Studies coordinator.

Internships in international trade, government, communications, business management and marketing can provide students with valuable skills and work experience. For information about companies involved in such areas in the southern New Jersey and Philadelphia area, contact the CHSS Match Program.
