Rowan University Graduation Requirements for all Majors / Degrees

- Students must complete at least 120 semester hours (sh) of coursework that apply to their Rowan University degree.
- Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 in Rowan University coursework. (Transfer courses/credit do not count toward the RU GPA.)
- A minimum of 30 sh of coursework must be completed at/through Rowan University.
- Only grades of "D-" or above may apply to graduation/degree requirements. (Some programs may set higher minimums.)
- Students must meet the Rowan Core and Rowan Experience Requirements.
- o An individual course can potentially satisfy one Rowan Core literacy and/or multiple Rowan Experience attributes.
 o Rowan Core & Rowan Experience designations are listed in course details in Section Tally (<u>www.rowan.edu/registrar</u>) and may also be searched on that site under "Attributes." A list of Rowan Core courses is here: https://confluence.rowan.edu/display/AS/Rowan+Core+Course

 Students must apply for graduation and should do so for the term in which they will complete all program requirements.

Program-Specific Graduation Requirements for this

- Students must receive a grade of C- or better in all 300- and 400- level History courses.
- Two 300/400 level history courses MUST be in global history: Africa, Asia, Latin America, Middle East, and/or Russia.
- Students may take as many or as few Topics in History and Global Topics in History courses as they wish.
- Students may fulfill the language requirement by completing the second semester of a foreign language, or a higher-level foreign language course, e.g. students who pass Spanish II do not need to take Spanish I. BA/MA students are strongly encouraged to take two years of one language.
- Juniors can apply to the program, where they take 4 graduate courses in their senior year, if they have 3.0 GPA, have completed HIST 05.306 Historical Methods, ANTH 02.202 Cultural Anthropology, and at least one upper level History course, and a faculty recommendation.

Rowan Core Requirements¹
