Students who entered Rowan University prior to Fall 2018 should follow the guide for their program and start year in consultation with their advisor.

## Rowan University Graduation Requirements for all Majors / Degrees

- Students must complete at least 120 semester hours (sh) of coursework that apply to their Rowan University degree.
- Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 in Rowan University coursework. (Transfer courses/credit do not count toward the RU GPA.)
- A minimum of 30 sh of coursework must be completed at/through Rowan University.
- Only grades of "D-" or above may apply to graduation/degree requirements. (Some programs may set higher minimums.)
- Students must meet the Rowan Core and Rowan Experience Requirements.
  - $\circ$  An individual course can potentially satisfy one Rowan Core literacy and/or multiple Rowan Experience attributes.
  - Rowan Core & Rowan Experience designations are listed in course details in Section Tally (<u>www.rowan.edu/registrar</u>) and may also be searched on that site under "Attributes." A list of Rowan Core courses is here: <u>https://confluence.rowan.edu/display/AS/Rowan+Core+Course+List.</u>
- Students must apply for graduation and should do so for the term in which they will complete all program requirements.

### Program-Specific Graduation Requirements for this Major / Degree

- Students must earn a minimum 2.0 G.P.A. in major courses
- Students must earn a minimum 3.3 G.P.A. undergraduate GPA
- Letter grades only in Anthropology courses; up to 10% of overall credits may be P/NC
- Only grades of "C"- or above may apply to graduation requirements
- Students must earn 30 credits in upper level (300, 400, 500 level) courses, including 19 upper-level anthropology credits
- No more than two courses can be repeated and each of these two can be repeated no more than twice.

## Rowan Core Requirements<sup>1</sup>

Students must satisfy all **six** Rowan Core Literacies. A minimum total of 3 sh of coursework is required to satisfy each Literacy. With the exception of the 9 sh counted here for Communicative Literacy, credits attached to the courses in this section will apply elsewhere.
