Academic Program Guide for Transfer Students (Effective Fall 2020)

Department of English

Students who entered Rowan University prior to Fall 2020 should follow the guide for their program and start year in consultation with their advisor.

Rowan University Graduation Requirements for all Majors / Degrees

- Students must complete at least 120 semester hours (sh) of coursework that apply to their Rowan University degree.
- Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 in Rowan University coursework. (Transfer courses/credit do not count toward the RU GPA.)
- A minimum of 30 sh of coursework must be completed at/through Rowan University.
- Only grades of "D-" or above may apply to graduation/degree requirements. (Some programs may set higher minimums.)
- Students must meet the General Education and Rowan Experience Requirements.
 - An individual course can potentially satisfy a General Education requirement and/or multiple Rowan Experience attributes.
- Students must apply for graduation and should do so for the term in which they will complete all program requirements.

Program-Specific Graduation Requirements for this Major / Degree

- Students must receive a C- or better in all courses satisfying Major requirements.

General Education Requirements¹

 - Choose 2 courses from approved Gen Ed guide (3 sh each)
