(Freshmen must take a course designated as a Rowan Seminar (RS), preferably a history course, in their first semester at Rowan.)

\* Students may fulfill the language requirement by completing the second semester of a foreign language, or a higher level foreign language course, e.g. students who pass Intermediate Spanish II do not need to take Spanish I, II or Inter. Spanish I; however, BA/MA students are encouraged to take at least 2 years of one language.

\*\*Students may take as many or as few *Topics in History* and *Global Topics in History* courses as they wish.

+Students may take any combination of History, General Education, and/or Free Electives courses to reach **120 credits**. These credits may be utilized to pursue certification, dual majors, minors, concentrations, the honors program, etc.
