ELECTIVES

Students may take any other courses--History, General Education, and/or Free Electives--to reach **120 credits**. These credits may be utilized to pursue certification, dual majors, minors, concentrations, the honors program, etc. We recommend that history students take additional 100-level courses electives to fulfill prerequisites for some upper history level courses.

** Students may fulfill the language requirement by completing the second semester of a foreign language, or a higher level foreign language course, e.g. students who pass Spanish II do not need to take Spanish I.

***Students may take as many or as few *Topics in History* and *Global Topics in History* courses as they wish.

In addition to fulfilling program requirements, all students are required to fulfill the university-wide General Education and Rowan Experience Requirements.
