ELECTIVES

Students may take any combination of History, General Education, and/or Free Electives courses to reach **120 credits**. These credits may be utilized to pursue certification, dual majors, minors, concentrations, the honors program, etc. We recommend that students focus some of their non program and free electives on courses related to European and/or Ancient Studies.

- * Language recommended for Ancient focus: Latin. Recommended for modern focus: French, German, Italian, Spanish, Russian.
- ** Students may fulfill the language requirement by completing the second semester of a foreign language, or a higher level foreign language course, e.g. students who pass Intermediate Spanish II do not need to take Spanish I, II or Inter. Spanish I.
- ***Students may take as many or as few *Topics in History* and *Global Topics in History* courses as they wish.

Freshmen must take a course designated as a Rowan Seminar (RS), preferably a history course, in their first semester at Rowan.
