

## MINOR PROGRAM IN POLITICAL SCIENCE

The minor program in political science supplements the curriculum of students majoring outside political science. It helps students expand their career options in such fields as law, journalism, business, government and intelligence.

The minor requires 21 semester hours of courses. Twelve of those semester hours are in courses that are required of all students who pursue a political science minor. The other nine are in upper-level electives taught by the political science department that students can tailor to their particular career or intellectual interests. NOTE: Credits for the Public Service Internship (EDPA 02.490) do not count toward the political science minor.
