The nine (9) competencies specified in this evaluation form are those established by Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). Under each competency statement are skills that have been identified by the school as desirable for a student in an MSW practice placement. The student behaviors that were assigned through the Learning Contract are the behaviors that become the basis for assessing the student's skills at the end of the semester.

Students are *not* expected to demonstrate all skills, and it is expected that there will be additional behaviors that are more appropriate to the agency and student learning that will be assigned to the student. The completion of this evaluation by the field instructor and the student can serve as a teaching-learning tool. It serves as a basis for assessing the student's professional growth, performance, and level of skill attained.
