

PROFESSIONAL GUIDELINES IN SOCIAL WORK

Demonstrating professionalism in the social work industry comes in many forms. Please review the following professional expectations—to be used as guidelines during the MSW program and in the social work field.

1. Attendance:

Students are required to attend all classes each semester, however students are permitted to miss two (2) classes without penalty. If a student is sick or injured and has a note from a physician, this will count as an excused absence. If a student misses class due to observance of a religious holiday/experience, this is also considered an excused absence. Active participation is a requirement in all courses. For classes that grade on participation, students will lose one point after the third unexcused absence and will continue to lose one point thereafter as applicable.

At the practicum site, students are expected to follow their approved schedule, which includes arriving on time, participating in meaningful work, leaving at designated time, and completing assigned tasks as instructed.

If a student experiences a short-term illness or death of an immediate family member and is absent from field placement, making up the missed hours should be negotiated between the field instructor and student. Alternate assignments, trainings, and other relevant opportunities could be used to make up hours. If a student is absent from or anticipates being gone from the placement site for an extended period (more than 1-2 weeks), and it could impact the student earning enough hours, the student must notify the field education director.

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2. Virtual Platform:

When using any virtual platform, including online class, meetings with a professor/field instructor/client/community partner/fellow student, etc., your background must be free from inappropriate or personal items and your actions/behavior must be professional. This includes:
