Rowan University Graduation Requirements for all Majors / Degrees

- Students must complete at least 120 semester hours (sh) of coursework that apply to their Rowan University degree.
- Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 in Rowan University coursework. (Transfer courses/credit do not count toward the RU GPA.)
- A minimum of 30 sh of coursework must be completed at/through Rowan University.
- Students must meet the Rowan Core and Rowan Experience Requirements.
 - o An individual course can potentially satisfy one Rowan Core literacy and/or multiple Rowan Experience attributes.
 - Rowan Core & Rowan Experience designations are listed in course details in Section Tally (https://sites.rowan.edu/registrar/services-resources/section-tally-info.html) and may also be searched on that site under "Attributes." A list of Rowan Core courses is posted at (https://sites.rowan.edu/ac-ademic-affairs/officeofacademicaffairs/assessment/rowan-core/rowan-core-courses.html).
- Students must apply for graduation and should do so for the term in which they will complete all program requirements.

Program-Specific Graduation Requirements for this Major / Degree

- Students with previous experience in a language should contact the Program Advisor, Cindy Finer (<u>finer@rowan.edu</u>), regarding initial course placement. A placement exam is available for Spanish and placement interviews are offered for all other languages included in the program. Students may earn credits for courses skipped through the Authorization for Credit by Examination process.
- Students may transfer in coursework from other institutions and from study abroad.
- Advanced Placement (AP) credits and CLEP Exam credits may also be applied in fulfillment of program requirements.
- Students must receive a grade of "C-" or better in all courses satisfying Major requirements.
- As an exit requirement, students must take Avant Assessment's STAMP 4S exam in their Advanced Language.
